Surplus Military Equipment Reporting - Extension

This bill reinstitutes the provisions of Chapter 321 of 2019, which terminated September 30, 2022. Specifically, the bill requires the Department of State Police (DSP), by February 1 each year, to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on the acquisition of equipment by law enforcement agencies through "surplus programs" within the preceding calendar year. DSP must include in a prominent location on its public website a link to the Defense Logistics Agency's report listing excess Department of Defense (DOD) property transfers to law enforcement agencies through the Law Enforcement Support Office.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: DSP can post and report the required information with existing resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: "Surplus program" means a program operated by the federal government for the transfer of surplus military equipment to a law enforcement agency.

Current Law: There are no statutory provisions governing the reporting of information relating to the acquisition of equipment by law enforcement agencies through "surplus programs." The requirement established by Chapter 321 terminated September 30, 2022.

Additional Comments: State and local law enforcement agencies can obtain excess federal property at little or no cost through the 1033 Program, the 1122 Program, and the Surplus Property Donation Program. The programs allow for the transfer of surplus DOD property and DOD property that might otherwise be destroyed, including vehicles (land, air, and sea), weapons, computer equipment, fingerprint equipment, night-vision equipment, radios and televisions, first-aid equipment, tents and sleeping bags, and photographic equipment.
