AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in the sponsor line, strike "Delegate Kerr" and substitute "Delegates Kerr, Alston, Bagnall, Bhandari, Chisholm, Cullison, Guzzone, Hill, Hutchinson, S. Johnson, Kaiser, Kipke, R. Lewis, Lopez, Martinez, M. Morgan, Pena-Melnyk, Reilly, Rosenberg, Szeliga, Taveras, White Holland, and Woods"; in lines 4 and 7, in each instance, strike "requiring" and substitute "<u>authorizing</u>"; strike beginning with "a" in line 4 down through the second "offeror" in line 5 and substitute "<u>an interested party</u>"; in line 9, strike "procurement unit personnel act" and substitute "<u>the unit acts</u>"; in line 10, strike "or regulation"; in line 19, after "Section" insert "<u>15–215,</u>"; and in the same line, after "15–221.1" insert a comma.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, after line 2, insert:

"<u>15–215.</u>

(a) In this Part III of this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) (1) <u>"Contract claim" means a claim that relates to a procurement</u> contract.

(2) <u>"Contract claim" includes a claim about the performance, breach,</u> modification, or termination of the procurement contract.

(C) "INTERESTED PARTY" MEANS AN ACTUAL OR A PROSPECTIVE BIDDER, OFFEROR, OR CONTRACTOR THAT MAY BE AGGRIEVED BY THE SOLICITATION OR AWARD OF A CONTRACT, OR BY THE PROTEST.

[(c)] (D) (1) <u>"Protest" means a complaint that relates to the formation of</u> <u>a procurement contract.</u>

- (2) "Protest" includes a complaint about:
 - (i) the qualifications of a bidder or offeror; or
 - (ii) the determination of the successful bidder or offeror.";

in line 4, strike "SHALL" and substitute "<u>MAY</u>"; strike beginning with "a" in line 4 down through the second "offeror" in line 5 and substitute "<u>AN INTERESTED PARTY</u>"; in line 7, strike "prospective bidder or offeror, bidder, or offeror" and substitute "<u>INTERESTED PARTY</u>"; in line 19, strike the brackets; in the same line, strike "SHALL"; strike line 21 in its entirety and substitute "<u>FINDS THAT THE CONDUCT OF THE UNIT</u>"; and strike line 23 in its entirety and substitute "<u>IN VIOLATION OF LAW.</u>".
