

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 1 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article - Health - General 4 20-120.In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 5 (a) (1) 6 (2) "Fund" means the Maryland Pediatric Cancer Fund established under 7 this section. 8 (3)"Pediatric cancer research" includes research to develop and advance the understanding of pediatric cancer and the techniques and modalities effective in the 9 10 prevention, cure, screening, and treatment of pediatric cancer. 11 (b) (1) There is a Maryland Pediatric Cancer Fund. 12(2) The Fund consists of: 13 (i) Money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund; and 14 (ii) Any donations or other money from any other source accepted for 15 the benefit of the Fund. 16 The Secretary shall administer the Fund. (3)17 (4) The Fund shall be used only for pediatric cancer research, prevention, and treatment] as provided in subsection (c) of this section. 18 19 The Fund shall be maintained for the purposes stated in this section 20 and unspent portions of the Fund shall remain in the Fund and may not revert to the 21General Fund of the State. 22 Money expended from the Fund for pediatric cancer research[, 23prevention, and treatment is supplemental and is not intended to take the place of funding 24that would otherwise be appropriated to the Department for pediatric cancer research. 25 prevention, and treatment]. 26 All expenditures from the Fund shall be made only in accordance with 27 an appropriation approved by the General Assembly in the annual State budget or through 28 an approved budget amendment under §§ 7-209 and 7-210 of the State Finance and 29 Procurement Article.

- 6 (5) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
 7 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
 8 QUALIFIES.
- 9 (6) A MEMBER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE FULL 10 TERMS.
- 11 (F) EACH MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION SHALL DISCLOSE TO THE STATE
 12 ETHICS COMMISSION WHETHER THE MEMBER IS EMPLOYED BY OR HAS A FINANCIAL
 13 INTEREST IN AN ENTITY THAT MAY APPLY TO CONDUCT STATE—FUNDED PEDIATRIC

- 15 (G) (1) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR NEGLECT OF DUTY, 16 INCOMPETENCE, MISCONDUCT, MALFEASANCE, MISFEASANCE, NONFEASANCE, OR 17 ANY OTHER SUFFICIENT CAUSE.
