BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Personnel and Pensions Section 29–304 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 29-304. An individual shall have immediate vesting rights on taking office in the State system in which the individual is a member if the individual is the: (1) secretary of a principal department of the Executive Branch of State government as provided under § 8–201 of the State Government Article;
