1 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY WITH RESPECT TO EDUCATION PROGRAMS 2 IN A CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION IN THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION IN THE 3 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.

4 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

5 (1) SET GOALS FOR THE NUMBER OF INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS IN
6 EDUCATION PROGRAMS;

7 (2) ESTABLISH A TRACKING SYSTEM FOR THE NUMBER OF 8 INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS IN EDUCATION PROGRAMS;

13(4)FORWARD, AT AN AGREED-ON INTERVAL, THE TRACKING DATA14FOR THE NUMBER OF COLLEGE CREDITS THAT EACH INCARCERATED INDIVIDUAL15EARNS IN AN APPROVED COLLEGE PROGRAM TO THE MARYLAND HIGHER16EDUCATION COMMISSION.

17 (D) THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION MAY ASSIST THE 18 DEPARTMENT IN CREATING THE TRACKING SYSTEMS UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF 19 THIS SECTION.

20 (E) FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE 21 ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT FOR THE 22 DEPARTMENT TO USE FOR MARKETING FOR EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO 23 INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS AND FOR THE TRACKING SYSTEMS FOR EDUCATION 24 PROGRAMS.

25 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 26 SECTION.

 1, 2024.
