BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 10 That: 11 The Maryland Department of Health shall study the feasibility of: (a) 12 (1) including among the coverage offered by the Maryland Healthy Smiles 13 Dental Program, with minimal benefit restrictions: 14 (i) removable full and partial dentures; and 15 reimbursement for providers on a per-patient basis for house 16 calls and extended care facility calls; and 17 (2)setting reimbursement rates for the services listed under item (1) of this 18 subsection at amounts that are: 19 at a level that ensures that all dental care providers are 20reimbursed adequately to provide access to care; and 21 not less than 60% of: (ii)

- 1 the average commercial rates for all payors in the State 2 who offer the services; or
- 3 2. if the average commercial rates cannot be determined, the 4 benchmark charges for the American Dental Association Current Dental Terminology 5 (CDT) codes of the services.
- 6 (b) In conducting the study required under subsection (a) of this section, the 7 Maryland Department of Health shall solicit input from:
- 8 (1) State chapters of national professional dental organizations; and
- 9 (2) advocacy groups that work to improve the oral health of the State's 10 low–income populations.
- 11 (c) On or before December 1, 2024, the Maryland Department of Health shall 12 report to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and Government 13 Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on 14 the findings of the feasibility study required under subsection (a) of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 16 1, 2024.
