CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Economic Development - Maryland Watermen's Microloan Program - Eligibility Economic Development - Maryland Agricultural and Resource-Based Industry Development Corporation - Loans
FOR the purpose of <u>altering a certain loan program to authorize the Maryland Agricultural and Resource–Based Industry Development Corporation to provide loans in a certain <u>amount for certain seasonal full–time jobs; requiring a recipient of a certain loan to make a certain annual report to the Corporation;</u> expanding eligibility for the Maryland Watermen's Microloan Program within the <u>Maryland Agricultural and Resource–Based Industry Development</u> Corporation to include, on or after a certain date, individuals who are residents of the State and hold certain commercial fishing licenses issued by the Potomac River Fisheries Commission; <u>repealing a certain</u></u>
requirement relating to the amount of a loan under the Program; and generally relating to the Maryland Watermen's Microloan Program.
