4 5 6	FOR the purpose of authorizing a voter to establish the voter's identity at the request of ar election judge at a polling place by presenting certain proof of identity; and generally relating to establishing a voter's identity at a polling place.
7 8 9 10 11	BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Election Law Section 10–310(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement)
12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
14	Article - Election Law
15	10–310.
16 17	(a) For each individual who seeks to vote, an election judge, in accordance with instructions provided by the local board, shall:
18 19	(1) locate the individual's name in the election register and locate the preprinted voting authority card and then authorize the individual to vote a regular ballot
20 21 22	(2) (i) if the individual's name is not found on the election register search the inactive list and if the name is found, authorize the individual to vote a regular ballot; or



1 2	(ii) if the individual's name is not on the inactive list, refer the individual for provisional ballot voting under § 9–404 of this article;
3	(3) establish the identity of the voter by requesting the voter to EITHER:
4 5	(I) state the month and day of the voter's birth and comparing the response to the information listed in the election register; OR
6 7	(II) PRESENT ANY OF THE FOLLOWING FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION:
8	1. THE VOTER'S VOTER REGISTRATION CARD;
9 10	2. THE VOTER'S VALID MARYLAND DRIVER'S LICENSE; OR
11 12 13 14 15	3. ANY IDENTIFICATION CARD THAT CONTAINS A PHOTOGRAPH OF THE VOTER AND IS ISSUED TO THE VOTER BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, OR ANY UNIT OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, THE STATE, OR THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT;
16 17	(4) (i) except if a voter's personal information has been deemed confidential by the local board, verify the address of the voter's residence; or
18 19	(ii) conduct an alternative verification as established by the State Board, if the voter's personal information has been deemed confidential by the local board;
20 21	(5) if any changes to the voting authority card are indicated by a voter, make the appropriate changes in information on the card or other appropriate form; and
22 23	(6) have the voter sign the voting authority card and either issue the voter a ballot or send the voter to a machine to vote.
24 25 26 27 28	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
