- 2 (e) (1) This subsection only applies to an individual who holds a license and 3 who seeks a different class license to drive a motor vehicle that, under the individual's current license, the individual is not authorized to drive.
- 5 (2) The holder of a learner's instructional permit may not take the driver's 6 license examination sooner than 14 days after the permit is issued.
- 7 (3) The 14 days' requirement may be waived if a subsequent learner's 8 instructional permit is issued or applied for.
- 9 (4) A learner's instructional permit issued to an individual described in 10 paragraph (1) of this subsection expires [180 days] 1 YEAR after THE date of issuance.
- 11 (5) A commercial driver's instructional permit issued to an individual described in paragraph (1) of this subsection expires 1 year after the date of issuance.

- (d) (1) A license [held by a member of the armed forces of the United States who is absent from this State on active service in the armed forces of the United States, or a dependent of the member who is residing with the member outside the State, shall remain in full force and effect during such absence] SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT DURING AN ABSENCE FROM THE STATE IF THE LICENSE IS HELD BY:
- 19 (I) 1. A MEMBER OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES WHO IS ABSENT FROM THIS STATE ON ACTIVE SERVICE IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES; OR

- 29 (2) The license also shall remain in effect, if it would otherwise have 30 expired under this section, for a period of 30 days following the date of the licensee's return 31 to this State, or the member's discharge or separation from active service:

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(i) If the licensee has in the licensee's immediate possession, together with the licensee's driver's license, papers indicating the member's active service outside this State or the member's discharge or separation; and
(ii) If the license is not otherwise suspended, revoked, or canceled under this title during the 30–day period.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
