1 AN ACT concerning

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Education - Coaches - Mental Health Training

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, in collaboration with the 4 Maryland Department of Health, each county board of education, and the Maryland 5 Public Secondary Schools Athletic Association, to develop guidelines for public 6 schools to train coaches to recognize indicators of mental illness and behavioral 7 distress in students; requiring each public school in the State that offers & 8 mainstream an athletic program to provide a certain mental health training to 9 coaches; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission, in collaboration 10 with the Maryland Department of Health, to develop guidelines for public 11 institutions of higher education to train coaches to recognize indicators of mental 12 illness and behavioral distress in students; requiring a public institution of higher 13 education that offers an athletic program to provide a certain mental health training 14 to coaches; and generally relating to coaches and mental health training.
