1 AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2024, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion, 6 Seven Hundred and Ninety-Two Million, Eight Hundred and Thirty Thousand 7 Dollars (\$1,792,830,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, 8 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital 9 equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection 10therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain 11 development and improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements that 12certain matching funds be provided and expended by certain dates; providing 13 generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; imposing a certain 14tax on all assessable property in the State; requiring that certain grantees convey 15certain easements under certain circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; 16providing that the proceeds of certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a 17certain date; authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain circumstances, to 18 approve certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain technical differences; 19authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and 20bond loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for 21certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; reducing prior 22authorizations of State Debt; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain 23locations; adding, altering, and repealing certain requirements for certain 24appropriations; specifying the use of certain project funds; altering and expanding 25the authorized purpose of certain grants; providing that certain grants may not 26terminate before certain dates; authorizing premiums from the sale of State bonds 27in certain fiscal years to be used for certain purposes; requiring the Comptroller to 28make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations; authorizing, in a certain 29fiscal year, the fund balance of a certain fund to exceed a certain limit; repealing 30 certain Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization acts; specifying 31the use of certain project funds; authorizing the creation of State Debt in certain

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 20That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2024 in the total principal amount of \$1,792,830,000.
This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation
bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and
delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the State Finance and
Procurement Article.

28 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a 29 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

30 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and 31 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the 32 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on 33 the books of the Comptroller and expended on approval by the Board of Public Works, for 34 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
