- by a law enforcement officer that addresses certain matters; requiring the Prince 6 7 George's County Police Department to require the use of sound level meters, subject 8 to a certain policy, by certain law enforcement officers on or before a certain date; 9 requiring the Department of General Services, in coordination with the Department 10 of Information Technology, to negotiate contracts, at the request of one or more law 11 enforcement agencies, with third parties for the acquisition or maintenance of sound 12 level meters, equipment, or technology for law enforcement agencies; and generally 13 relating to the use of sound level meters by law enforcement agencies.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article Public Safety
- 22 **3–531.**
- 23 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 24 INDICATED.



- 1 (2) "LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 2 3–201 of this title.
- 3 (3) "SOUND LEVEL METER" MEANS A DEVICE USED FOR MEASURING 4 THE INTENSITY OF NOISE AND OTHER SOUNDS.
- 5 (B) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2025, THE MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING
 6 AND STANDARDS COMMISSION SHALL DEVELOP AND PUBLISH ONLINE A POLICY
 7 FOR THE ISSUANCE AND USE OF A SOUND LEVEL METER BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT
 8 OFFICER THAT ADDRESSES:
- 9 (1) THE TESTING OF SOUND LEVEL METERS TO ENSURE ADEQUATE 10 FUNCTIONING;
- 11 (2) THE PROCEDURE FOR THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER TO 12 FOLLOW IF THE SOUND LEVEL METER FAILS TO PROPERLY OPERATE AT THE 13 BEGINNING OF OR DURING THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S SHIFT;
- 14 (3) WHEN MEASURING IS MANDATORY;
- 15 (4) WHEN MEASURING IS PROHIBITED;
- 16 (5) WHEN MEASURING IS DISCRETIONARY;
- 17 (6) CONSEQUENCES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT 18 AGENCY'S SOUND LEVEL METER POLICY; AND
- 19 (7) ANY ADDITIONAL ISSUES DETERMINED TO BE RELEVANT IN THE 20 IMPLEMENTATION AND USE OF SOUND LEVEL METERS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT 21 OFFICERS.
- 22 (C) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2025, THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY POLICE
 23 DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE THE USE OF SOUND LEVEL METERS, SUBJECT TO THE
 24 POLICY ON THE USE OF SOUND LEVEL METERS DEVELOPED BY THE MARYLAND
 25 POLICE TRAINING AND STANDARDS COMMISSION UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
 26 SECTION, BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT AS
 27 PART OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S OFFICIAL DUTIES.
- 28 (D) (1) THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT SHALL
 29 DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN A WRITTEN POLICY CONSISTENT WITH THE POLICY
 30 PUBLISHED BY THE MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING AND STANDARDS COMMISSION
 31 UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE USE OF SOUND LEVEL METERS.

- 1 (2) A POLICY DEVELOPED AND MAINTAINED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)
- 2 OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL SPECIFY WHICH LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS
- 3 EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT ARE REQUIRED TO USE SOUND LEVEL METERS.
- 4 (E) THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT
- 5 NEGATE OR ALTER ANY OF THE REQUIREMENTS OR POLICIES ESTABLISHED IN
- 6 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION THROUGH COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.
- 7 **3–532.**
- 8 (A) (1) THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, IN COORDINATION
- 9 WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, SHALL NEGOTIATE
- 10 CONTRACTS, AT THE REQUEST OF ONE OR MORE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES,
- 11 WITH THIRD PARTIES FOR THE ACQUISITION OR MAINTENANCE OF SOUND LEVEL
- 12 METERS, EQUIPMENT, OR TECHNOLOGY FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.
- 13 (2) THE CONTRACTS NEGOTIATED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
- 14 SUBSECTION MAY INCLUDE CONTRACTS FOR ANY RELATED EQUIPMENT OR
- 15 TECHNOLOGY DETERMINED TO BE NECESSARY FOR THE EFFECTIVE USE OF SOUND
- 16 LEVEL METERS.
- 17 (3) THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES SHALL NOTIFY ALL
- 18 LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE CONTRACTS THAT ARE BEING NEGOTIATED
- 19 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION BY POSTING THE CONTRACTS ON
- 20 EMARYLAND MARKETPLACE ADVANTAGE.
- 21 (B) THE CONTRACTS NEGOTIATED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS
- 22 SECTION SHALL PRIORITIZE:
- 23 (1) EQUIPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY THAT COMPLY WITH THE
- 24 POLICIES DEVELOPED BY THE MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING AND STANDARDS
- 25 COMMISSION UNDER § 3–531 OF THIS SUBTITLE;
- 26 (2) EQUIPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY THAT CONFORM TO INDUSTRY
- 27 STANDARDS AND BEST PRACTICES;
- 28 (3) COMPATIBILITY WITH DIFFERENT EQUIPMENT AND
- 29 TECHNOLOGY; AND
- 30 (4) COST EFFECTIVENESS.

- 1 (C) FOR ANY CONTRACT NEGOTIATED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE RIGHT OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO RECEIVE SERVICES FROM AN ENTITY RELATED TO EDITING OR TRANSFERRING DATA FROM SOUND LEVEL METERS MAY NOT BE RESTRICTED IN ANY MANNER.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2024.
