1 (I) SURGERY USING AN INSTRUMENT, INCLUDING A LASER, A 2 SCALPEL, A NEEDLE, CAUTERY, A CRYOPROBE, OR A SUTURE, IN WHICH HUMAN 3 TISSUE IS CUT, BURNED, VAPORIZED, REMOVED, OR OTHERWISE PERMANENTLY 4 ALTERED BY MECHANICAL MEANS, LASER, IONIZING RADIATION, ULTRASOUND, OR 5 OTHER MEANS;

- 6 (II) OSSEO-INTEGRATED DEVICE SURGERY;
- 7 (III) COCHLEAR IMPLANT SURGERY; OR

8 (IV) THE PREPARATION, OPERATION, OR PERFORMANCE OF 9 RADIOGRAPHIC IMAGING.

10 (R-1) "SOUND PROCESSOR" MEANS A NONSURGICAL, EXTERNAL UNIT THAT 11 ATTACHES TO AN INTERNAL OSSEO–INTEGRATED DEVICE OR COCHLEAR IMPLANT.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2024.
