- 3 (2) a subsequent search using the FGG profile in a publicly available 4 open—data personal genomics database or a direct—to—consumer genetic genealogy service 5 to find individuals related to the source of the FGG profile; and
- 6 (3) a genealogical search using public records and other lawful means to obtain information in accordance with this title.

- 9 This title does not apply to FGGS conducted solely for the 10 purpose of identifying an individual under the age of 18 years who is:
- 11 (1) DECEASED; OR
- 12 (2) THE SUBJECT OF A MISSING PERSON REPORT FILED WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IN THE STATE AND WHOSE WHEREABOUTS ARE UNKNOWN.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
