- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Correctional Services Apprenticeship Start-Up Grant 4 Program in the Maryland Department of Labor; establishing requirements for 5 sponsors, employers, and apprentices participating in a correctional services 6 apprenticeship program; requiring the Career and Technical Education Committee 7 to determine whether changes to the rules, regulations, procedures, or funding of the 8 State Department of Education are necessary to implement the Grant Program; and 9 generally relating to the Correctional Services Apprenticeship Start-Up Grant Program. 10

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS

- 22 (2) "GRANT PROGRAM" MEANS THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES
- 23 APPRENTICESHIP START-UP GRANT PROGRAM.



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- "SPONSOR" MEANS AN ORGANIZATION THAT DEVELOPS AND 1 **(3)** 2 IMPLEMENTS A CORRECTIONAL SERVICES APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM.
- 3 THERE IS A CORRECTIONAL SERVICES APPRENTICESHIP START-UP 4 GRANT PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.
- THE PURPOSES OF THE GRANT PROGRAM ARE TO: 5 (C)
- 6 **(1)** PROVIDE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND INDIVIDUALS CHANGING 7 CAREERS OPPORTUNITIES TO BEGIN A CAREER WITHIN CORRECTIONAL SERVICES IN THE STATE; 8
- 9 **(2)** DEVELOP A COHORT OF INDIVIDUALS QUALIFIED TO WORK IN CORRECTIONAL SERVICES IN THE STATE; AND 10
- ENCOURAGE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES TO HIRE APPRENTICES. 11 **(3)**

(I) ALLOW A STUDENT PARTICIPATING IN THE CORRECTIONAL

(F) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:
(I) ADMINISTER THE GRANT PROGRAM; AND
(II) AWARD A GRANT TO A SPONSOR THAT MEETS THE
REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
(2) TO RECEIVE A GRANT UNDER THE GRANT PROGRAM, A
SPONSOR'S APPRENTICESHIP SHALL:
(I) MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION;

(II) HAVE UNION PARTICIPATION; AND
(ii) interminination, and
(III) BE APPROVED BY THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND

TRAINING COUNCIL.

- 1 (G) THE DEPARTMENT MAY AWARD UP TO \$500,000 TO A SPONSOR FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND LAUNCH OF A CORRECTIONAL SERVICES APPRENTICESHIP FROM FEDERAL OR STATE FUNDS.
- 4 (H) THE CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED
 5 UNDER § 21–209 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER ANY
 6 CHANGES TO THE RULES, REGULATIONS, PROCEDURES, OR FUNDING OF THE STATE
 7 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION ARE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE GRANT
 8 PROGRAM.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2024.
