BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–803(a)(1), (c), and (d) Annotated Code of Maryland (2020 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 21–803(a)(4) Annotated Code of Maryland

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

4 21-803.

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- 5 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (3) through (5) of this subsection, if, on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation, a local authority determines that any maximum speed limit specified in this subtitle is greater or less than reasonable or safe under existing conditions on any part of a highway in its jurisdiction, it may establish a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit for that part of the highway, which may:
- 10 (i) Decrease the limit at an intersection;
- 11 (ii) Increase the limit in an urban district to not more than 50 miles 12 per hour;
- 13 (iii) Decrease the limit in an urban district; or
- 14 (iv) Decrease the limit outside an urban district to not less than 25 15 miles per hour.
- 16 (4) (i) This paragraph applies only to:
- 17 1. Montgomery County; and
- 18 2. Municipalities located in Montgomery County.
- 19 (ii) A local authority may decrease the maximum speed limit to not 20 less than 15 miles per hour on a highway [only after performing an engineering and traffic 21 investigation].
- 22 (iii) A local authority may not implement a new speed monitoring 23 system to enforce speed limits on any A portion of a highway for which the speed limit has 24 been decreased under this paragraph <u>NOT EARLIER THAN 1 YEAR AFTER THE</u> 25 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECREASE IN THE SPEED LIMIT.
- 26 (c) An altered maximum speed limit established under this section is effective when posted on appropriate signs giving notice of the limit.
- 28 (d) Except in Baltimore City, any alteration by a local authority of a maximum 29 speed limit on a part or extension of a State highway is not effective until it is approved by 30 the State Highway Administration.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32 October 1, 2024.
