1 AN ACT concerning

2 Social Media Platforms – Vloggers and Video Content Featuring Minors

FOR the purpose of requiring a vlogger who creates video content that is posted on a social media platform and features a certain minor child to compensate the child under certain circumstances; establishing requirements on social media platforms relating to deleting video content featuring minor children; applying certain requirements related to the labor of minors to children compensated by vloggers; and generally relating to minors featured in social media content.

2 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 3 INDICATED.

4 (B) "CHILD" MEANS, WITH RESPECT TO A VLOGGER, A MINOR FOR WHOM
5 THE VLOGGER OR, IF THE VLOGGER IS A BUSINESS ENTITY, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS
6 AN INTEREST IN THE BUSINESS ENTITY IS THE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN.

7 (C) "FEATURE" MEANS TO USE THE LIKENESS OR NAME OF AN INDIVIDUAL 8 OR TO CAUSE AN INDIVIDUAL TO BE THE SUBJECT OF A NARRATIVE.

9 (D) "VLOGGER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL OR A BUSINESS ENTITY THAT 10 CREATES VIDEO CONTENT TO BE POSTED ON A SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORM IN 11 EXCHANGE FOR COMPENSATION.

A VLOGGER THAT FEATURES A CHILD IN THE VLOGGER'S VIDEO CONTENT SHALL COMPENSATE THE CHILD IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 19–1003 OF THIS SUBTITLE IF AT ANY TIME WITHIN THE PREVIOUS 12–MONTH PERIOD:

16 (1) (I) THE VLOGGER QUALIFIED FOR COMPENSATION FROM A
 17 SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORM BASED ON THE NUMBER OF VIEWS ANY OF THE VLOGGER'S
 18 VIDEO CONTENT RECEIVED; OR

19(II)THE VLOGGER ACTUALLY RECEIVED COMPENSATION OF AT20LEAST \$0.10 PER VIEW FOR ANY OF THE VLOGGER'S VIDEO CONTENT; AND

21 (2) THE CHILD WAS FEATURED FOR AT LEAST 30% OF THE TOTAL 22 DURATION OF ALL CONTENT POSTED WITHIN ANY 30–DAY PERIOD.

23 **19–1003.**

A VLOGGER THAT IS REQUIRED TO COMPENSATE ONE OR MORE CHILDREN UNDER § 19–1002 OF THIS SUBTITLE SHALL PAY INTO A SEPARATE TRUST FOR THE BENEFIT OF EACH CHILD ON ATTAINING 18 YEARS OF AGE AS FOLLOWS:

(1) IF THE VLOGGER IS REQUIRED TO COMPENSATE ONE CHILD, THE
 PERCENTAGE OF GROSS EARNINGS ATTRIBUTABLE TO CONTENT IN WHICH THE
 CHILD WAS FEATURED SHALL BE PAID INTO THE TRUST FOR THE CHILD; AND

1 (2) IF THE VLOGGER IS REQUIRED TO COMPENSATE MORE THAN ONE 2 CHILD, THE PERCENTAGE OF GROSS EARNINGS ATTRIBUTABLE TO CONTENT IN 3 WHICH AT LEAST ONE OF THOSE CHILDREN WAS FEATURED SHALL BE DIVIDED 4 EQUALLY AMONG THE CHILDREN AND PAID INTO THE SEPARATE TRUST FOR EACH 5 CHILD.

7 (A) AN ADULT WHO WAS FEATURED IN VIDEO CONTENT OF A VLOGGER AS A
8 MINOR CHILD ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2024, MAY REQUEST THE PERMANENT
9 DELETION OF THE CONTENT.

10 **(B)** A SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORM THAT RECEIVES A DELETION REQUEST 11 UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL TAKE ALL REASONABLE STEPS TO 12 PERMANENTLY DELETE ALL CONTENT FOR WHICH THE REQUEST WAS MADE.

13(C)A CONTRACT BETWEEN A VLOGGER AND A SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORM14FOR THE CREATION OF VIDEO CONTENT THAT WOULD REASONABLY BE15ANTICIPATED TO FEATURE A MINOR CHILD SHALL INCLUDE NOTIFICATION TO THE16SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORM OF THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD UNDER THIS SECTION.

17**Article – Labor and Employment** 183 - 203.19 This subtitle does not apply to an activity that a minor performs if the activity: 20(4) is limited to: 21(i) farm work that is performed on a farm; 22(ii) domestic work that is performed in or about a home; 23work that is performed in a business that a parent of the minor (iii) or a person standing in place of the parent owns or operates, OTHER THAN WORK 24PERFORMED BY A MINOR CHILD THAT IS REQUIRED TO BE COMPENSATED BY A 25**VLOGGER UNDER TITLE 19, SUBTITLE 10 OF THE BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE;** 2627(iv) caddying on a golf course; 28instructing on an instructional sailboat; (v) 29delivery of newspapers to consumers; (vi)
