Criminal Law - Crimes Relating to Animals - Conviction and Sentencing

- FOR the purpose of establishing that each animal harmed in a violation of a prohibition against animal cruelty is a separate offense; establishing that a conviction for a crime relating to animals may not merge with a conviction for any other crime based on the act establishing the violation and that a sentence imposed may be separate from and consecutive to or concurrent with a sentence based on the act establishing a violation; and generally relating to crimes relating to animals.
