- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the department charged with oversight of a State-owned 5 nursing home operated by a contractor, instead of the contractor, to provide notice of 6 certain deficiencies and enforcement actions to certain persons; requiring that the 7 notice be provided within a certain time period after a final survey finding; requiring 8 the department charged with oversight, rather than the contractor, to provide 9 certain information to certain persons within a certain time period after the 10 contractor's final acceptance of a plan of correction or completion of an informal 11 dispute resolution, rather than after the contractor's receipt of a citation or fine; and 12 generally relating to State-owned nursing homes.
