A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Retirement and Pension System – Average Final Compensation – Compensation Adjustments

FOR the purpose of establishing that certain adjustments to compensation may not be
considered an extraordinary salary increase when determining the average final
compensation of a member in the State Retirement and Pension System; requiring a
member to submit certain information to the State Retirement Agency at the time of
retirement; and generally relating to the calculation of average final compensation
in the State Retirement and Pension System.

11 (II) A MEMBER SHALL PROVIDE THE NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER 12 SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH WHEN THE MEMBER SUBMITS AN 13 APPLICATION FOR RETIREMENT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2024.
