### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Maryland Department of Emergency Management – Office of Domestic Terrorism Response

FOR the purpose of establishing the Office of Domestic Terrorism Response within the
Maryland Department of Emergency Management for the purpose of implementing
measures to prepare for, prevent, and recover from domestic terrorism and hate
crimes; requiring the Maryland Task Force on Preventing and Countering Domestic
Terrorism to serve in an advisory role for the Office; and generally relating to
emergency management and the Office of Domestic Terrorism Response.

### Preamble

WHEREAS, In accordance with the Joint Chairmen's Report on the Operating Budget for fiscal 2023, the Maryland Department of Emergency Management submitted the Summary Report and Recommendations of the Task Force on Preventing and Countering Domestic Terrorism in December 2022; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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1 WHEREAS, The report of the Task Force on Preventing and Countering Domestic 2 Terrorism made several recommendations following a series of meetings focused on how to 3 deter domestic terrorism in Maryland; and

WHEREAS, One of the recommendations from the report was to invest in a permanent State of Maryland capability focused on the prevention of violent extremist acts; and

WHEREAS, In the United States, since the early 1980s, domestic terrorist attacks are occurring more frequently, and hate crimes, as reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, are the highest they have been in over a decade; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 12 Article Public Safety
- 13 14–101.

14 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

15 (b) "Department" means the Maryland Department of Emergency Management.

17 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "OFFICE" MEANS THE OFFICE OF DOMESTIC 18 TERRORISM RESPONSE.

19 (B) (1) THERE IS AN OFFICE OF DOMESTIC TERRORISM RESPONSE IN 20 THE DEPARTMENT.

21 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE OFFICE IS TO PREPARE FOR, PREVENT, 22 AND RECOVER FROM DOMESTIC TERRORISM AND HATE CRIMES.

23(c)THE OFFICE SHALL COORDINATE WITH FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL24AGENCIES IN DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING PLANS TO:

(1) MAXIMIZE THE ROLE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION PLAY
 IN RESEARCHING AND DEVELOPING PROFESSIONAL TRAINING ON THE PREVENTION
 OF VIOLENT EXTREMIST ACTS; AND

28 (2) RAISE AWARENESS AMONG THE PUBLIC ABOUT VIOLENT 29 EXTREMISM, INCLUDING VIOLENT EXTREMISM ASSOCIATED WITH HATE CRIMES, 30 DOMESTIC TERRORISM, AND INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM.

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1 (D) THE MARYLAND TASK FORCE ON PREVENTING AND COUNTERING 2 DOMESTIC TERRORISM SHALL SERVE IN AN ADVISORY ROLE FOR THE OFFICE.

3 (E) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 4 REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE 5 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON:

- 6 (1) THE ACTIVITIES OF THE OFFICE;
- 7 (2) ANY RECOMMENDED LEGISLATION; AND
- 8 (3) ANY RESOURCES THAT THE OFFICE REQUIRES TO CARRY OUT ITS 9 PURPOSE AND DUTIES.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2024.
