- the strength and depth of the required instructional content in 10 the middle school and high school Social Studies State Frameworks: 11
- 12 <del>(ii)</del> the effectiveness of the implementation of the high school State Frameworks for Modern World History and United States History; and 13
- <del>(iii)</del> the status, availability, and effectiveness of professional 14 development for teachers providing instruction in Holocaust education. 15
- 16 The consultant conducting the study under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall make recommendations on improving Holocaust education in the State. 17
  - The State Department of Education shall provide any information requested by the consultant conducting the study and assessment under subsection (a) of this section in a timely manner.
- On or before December 31, 2024, the State Department of Education shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance 22 23with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly, that summarizes the results of the study and assessment conducted in accordance with subsection (a) of this 24 25 section.
- 26 SECTION 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the 27 end of June 30, 2025, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General 28 29 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
