 and a public high school to begin instruction not earlier than certain times unless
 granted a waiver by the county board of education under certain circumstances; and

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 (e) (1) The county boards of Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Howard, 8 Montgomery, and Prince George's counties, and the Board of School Commissioners of 9 Baltimore City, may elect to operate one or more schools within the county or Baltimore 10 City on a year-round basis, provided that the 180-day and the minimum hour 11 requirements under this section are met.

12 (2) Nothing in this section precludes a county board from conducting a 13 year-round pilot study or program that is funded by the county board.

14 (f) Publicly funded half-day prekindergarten programs are not subject to the 15 requirements of subsection (a) of this section.

16 (G) A COUNTY BOARD MAY GRANT A WAIVER TO A MIDDLE SCHOOL OR HIGH 17 SCHOOL TO BEGIN INSTRUCTION AT A TIME EARLIER THAN THE TIME SPECIFIED 18 UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(3) OF THIS SECTION IF THE COUNTY BOARD DETERMINES 19 THAT THE SCHOOL HAS A COMPELLING REASON FOR REQUIRING A DIFFERENT 20 START TIME.

[(g)] (H) Notwithstanding any other law and subject only to this section, each county board annually shall set the start and end dates of the school year for schools in the county.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2024.

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
