2 Transportation - <u>Major</u> Change in Bus Service - <u>Impacts Report</u> <u>Publication on</u> 3 <u>Website</u>

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Transit Administration, before announcing any 4 reduction or cancellation of an existing bus route or line, to compile a report on the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 impacts of the proposed service reduction or cancellation; requiring the 7Administration to publish the report on its website at least a certain number of days 8 before the required public hearing on the proposed service change altering the 9 information that the Maryland Transit Administration is required to publish on its 10 website before holding a public hearing on a major service change; requiring the Administration to distribute the report a certain report on proposed major service 11 changes to certain officials and entities; and generally relating to service reductions 12or cancellations of major service changes for existing bus routes. 13
