### A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

## Property Tax Credit – Disabled or Fallen Law Enforcement Officer or Rescue Worker – Alterations

4 FOR the purpose of altering, for purposes of a certain property tax credit for a certain dwelling, the definition of "fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker" to include  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 disabled law enforcement officers or rescue workers who have died regardless of the 7 cause of death; repealing a certain requirement, and the authority of a county to 8 impose a requirement, that, for purposes of eligibility for the credit, the dwelling 9 must have been acquired by the disabled or fallen law enforcement officer or rescue 10 worker or the surviving spouse or cohabitant within a certain number of years after 11 a certain finding; requiring the amount of the credit for a newly acquired dwelling 12owned by a disabled or fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker or the 13 surviving spouse or cohabitant to be in the same proportion as the property tax credit 14 for a certain former dwelling; requiring, under certain circumstances, the amount of 15the credit for a dwelling owned by a disabled or fallen law enforcement officer or 16rescue worker or the surviving spouse or cohabitant to be in the same proportion as 17the property tax credit initially granted for the dwelling; and generally relating to a 18 property tax credit for a dwelling owned by a disabled or fallen law enforcement 19officer or rescue worker or the surviving spouse or cohabitant.

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1 AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DIES as a result of or in the course of (i)  $\mathbf{2}$ employment as a law enforcement officer or a correctional officer; [or]

3 (ii) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DIES while in the active service of a fire, 4 rescue, or emergency medical service, unless the death was the result of the individual's  $\mathbf{5}$ own willful misconduct or abuse of alcohol or drugs; OR

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 21 1, 2024, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30, 2024.

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
