2 Economic Development – Maryland Watermen's Microloan Program – Eligibility 3 Economic Development – Maryland Agricultural and Resource–Based Industry 4 Development Corporation – Loans

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of altering a certain loan program to authorize the Maryland Agricultural 6 and Resource–Based Industry Development Corporation to provide loans in a certain 7 amount for certain seasonal full-time jobs; requiring a recipient of a certain loan to 8 make a certain annual report to the Corporation; expanding eligibility for the 9 Maryland Watermen's Microloan Program within the Maryland Agricultural and 10 Resource Based Industry Development Corporation to include, on or after a certain date, individuals who are residents of the State and hold certain commercial fishing 11 12licenses issued by the Potomac River Fisheries Commission; repealing a certain requirement relating to the amount of a loan under the Program; and generally 13 14 relating to the Maryland Watermen's Microloan Program.
