- 1 a Heat and Eat Program in accordance with § 5-506 of this (ii) 2 subtitle. 3 (b) The State shall bear the nonfederal portion of the administrative costs of the 4 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for each county. 5 Each local department shall administer the Supplemental Nutrition 6 Assistance Program: 7 (1) under the supervision and control of the Department; and
- 9 (d) If a household includes an individual who [is at least 62 years old and]
 10 receives a federally funded benefit in an amount less than [\$40] \$95 per month under the
 11 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, the State shall provide a supplement to
 12 increase the total benefit to [\$40] \$95 per month.
