SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

1 (1) The entire width between the boundary lines of any way or 2 thoroughfare of which any part is used by the public for vehicular travel, whether or not 3 the way or thoroughfare has been dedicated to the public and accepted by any proper 4 authority; and

5 (2) For purposes of the application of State laws, the entire width between 6 the boundary lines of any way or thoroughfare used for purposes of vehicular travel on any 7 property owned, leased, or controlled by the United States government and located in the 8 State.

10 (a) Every person riding an animal or driving an animal-drawn vehicle on a 11 roadway has all the rights granted to and is subject to all the duties required of the driver 12 of a vehicle by this title, except for those provisions of this title that by their very nature 13 cannot apply.

14 (b) (1) Except in Charles, Worcester, and St. Mary's counties, or as provided 15 in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person may not ride an animal or drive an 16 animal-drawn vehicle on:

(i) Any divided highway where the posted maximum speed limit ismore than 35 miles per hour; or

20 (2) In Anne Arundel County, a person may ride an animal on any part of a 21 highway described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, other than on its roadway or 22 shoulder.
