BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 5–301(a) and (c) and 5–304(b)(1) and (d)(2) Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 5-309 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Safety 5-301. (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. (c) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport

- 2 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may 3 charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.
- 4 (d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:
- 5 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal 6 corporation of the State.

- 8 (a) Except as provided in [subsection] SUBSECTIONS (d) AND (E) of this section, 9 a permit expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years after the date 10 the permit is issued.
- 11 (b) [Subject] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION
  12 AND SUBJECT to subsection (c) of this section, a permit may be renewed for successive
  13 periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for renewal, the applicant possesses
  14 the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays the renewal fee stated in this
  15 subtitle.
- 16 (c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be 17 fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person's fingerprints to resolve a 18 question of the person's identity.
- 19 (d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to 20 coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:
- 21 (1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and 22 Professions Article;
- 23 (2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and 24 Professions Article; or
- 25 (3) a special police officer under § 3–306 of this article.
- 26 (E) A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO
  27 RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING FROM SERVICE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
  28 OF THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE:
- 29 (1) EXPIRES ON THE LAST DAY OF THE HOLDER'S BIRTH MONTH 30 FOLLOWING 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE PERMIT IS ISSUED; AND
  - (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, MAY BE RENEWED

- 1 FOR SUCCESSIVE PERIODS OF 5 YEARS EACH IF, AT THE TIME OF AN APPLICATION
- 2 FOR RENEWAL, THE APPLICANT POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE
- 3 ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October 1, 2024.
