- 3 (h) At the Workgroup's first meeting, the Workgroup shall vote to adopt a code of conduct providing for the acceptable conduct of Workgroup members.
- 5 (a) In this section, "Department" means the Maryland Department of Emergency 6 Management.
- 7 <u>(i)</u> (b) The Workgroup <u>Department</u>, in <u>consultation</u> with <u>other interested</u> 8 <u>stakeholders</u>, shall study and make recommendations regarding:

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
