BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 4-116(b) and 5-112(b)(1)Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
