## A BILL ENTITLED

(Nursing Home Staffing Crisis Funding Act of 2024)

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring that the Governor's proposed budget for certain fiscal years 5 include a certain percentage reimbursement rate increase for providers of certain 6 health care services under the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, the Maryland 7 Children's Health Program, and the Community First Choice program; requiring 8 nursing homes to annually submit a certain cost report to the Maryland Department 9 of Health; requiring that a certain percentage of the funding increase for certain fiscal years be used to fund wages and benefits for certain workers; and generally 10 11 relating to the reimbursement of service providers under the Maryland Medical 12 Assistance Program, the Maryland Children's Health Program, and the Community First Choice program. 13

Nursing home providers who receive funding increases in accordance with §

16-201.4(b)(5) through (7) of the Health - General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this

Act, shall document the disbursement of the funds.
