1 (i) \$1,283,000 to existing providers in the same amount as was 2 provided in fiscal year 2022;

3 (ii) \$1,917,000 to existing providers in the same proportion as was 4 provided in fiscal year 2022 to provide additional services; and

5 (iii) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, \$500,000 6 to new providers or existing providers to enroll additional children.

7 (3) If funds are remaining after the distribution required under paragraph 8 (2)(iii) of this subsection, then the remainder shall be distributed as provided under 9 paragraph (2)(ii) of this subsection.
