1 (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1)(ii) of this subsection, an individual 2 under the age of 18 years:

3 (i) may vote in a primary election in which candidates are 4 nominated for a general or special election that will occur when the individual is at least 5 18 years old; and

(ii) may not vote in any other election.

7 (b) An individual is not qualified to be a registered voter if the individual:

8 (1) has been convicted of a felony and is currently serving a court-ordered 9 sentence of imprisonment for the conviction;

10 (2) is under guardianship for mental disability and a court of competent 11 jurisdiction has specifically found by clear and convincing evidence that the individual 12 cannot communicate, with or without accommodations, a desire to participate in the voting 13 process; or

14 (3) has been convicted of buying or selling votes.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 January 1, 2025.
