BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Natural Resources Section 4–607, 4–614(a), 4–745(e), and 10–303(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2023 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Natural Resources Section 4-745(a)(1)Annotated Code of Maryland (2023 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement)
