BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Safety 3-106.1. (A) THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT PROHIBIT SUMMARY PUNISHMENT BY HIGHER RANKING POLICE OFFICERS AS DESIGNATED BY THE CHIEF. (B) SUMMARY PUNISHMENT MAY BE IMPOSED FOR A MINOR VIOLATION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY RULES AND REGULATIONS THAT DOES NOT INVOLVE
