SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings

16 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "CREATIVE EXPRESSION" MEANS THE EXPRESSION OR 17 APPLICATION OF CREATIVITY OR IMAGINATION IN THE PRODUCTION OR 18 ARRANGEMENT OF FORMS, SOUNDS, WORDS, MOVEMENTS, OR SYMBOLS.

19 **(B)** IN ANY CRIMINAL PROCEEDING OR JUVENILE PROCEEDING, THE 20 CREATIVE EXPRESSION OF A DEFENDANT OR RESPONDENT IS NOT ADMISSIBLE 21 AGAINST THE DEFENDANT OR RESPONDENT UNLESS THE COURT FINDS, BY CLEAR 22 AND CONVINCING EVIDENCE, THAT:

1 (1) (I) THE DEFENDANT OR RESPONDENT INTENDED THE 2 CREATIVE EXPRESSION TO BE LITERAL, RATHER THAN FIGURATIVE OR FICTIONAL; 3 OR

4 (II) IF THE CREATIVE EXPRESSION IS DERIVATIVE, THE 5 DEFENDANT INTENDED TO ADOPT THE LITERAL MEANING OF THE CREATIVE 6 EXPRESSION AS THEIR OWN;

7 (2) THERE IS A STRONG INDICATION THAT THE CREATIVE 8 EXPRESSION REFERS TO THE SPECIFIC FACTS OF THE ALLEGED OFFENSE;

9 (3) THE CREATIVE EXPRESSION IS RELEVANT TO A DISPUTED ISSUE 10 OF FACT; AND

11 (4) THE CREATIVE EXPRESSION HAS PROBATIVE VALUE THAT 12 CANNOT BE PROVIDED BY OTHER ADMISSIBLE EVIDENCE.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 October 1, 2024.
