$5\\6\\7$	(d) (1) For calendar years 2022 through 2025, the Exchange, in consultation with the Commissioner and as approved by the Board, shall establish subsidy eligibility and payment parameters for the Pilot Program.

14 15 16 17 18	(e) (1) Subject to available funds AND PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, in each of fiscal years 2022 through 2026, the Exchange may designate funds from the Fund to be used for the Pilot Program so that [not more than \$20,000,000 in] annual subsidies may be provided to young adults who meet the subsidy eligibility and payment parameters established under subsection (d) of this section.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
