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Vehicle Laws - Bicycles - Operation at Intersections

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a person operating a bicycle that is approaching a stop sign at an intersection on certain highways to cautiously make a turn or proceed through
- 5 the intersection without stopping if the person reduces the speed of the bicycle to a
- reasonable rate and yields the right-of-way to certain vehicles under certain
- 7 circumstances; and generally relating to the operation of bicycles on highways.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (a) [Unless] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C-1) OF THIS SECTION.

27 28 29	(a) Every person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter in a public bicycle area has all the rights granted to and is subject to all the duties required of the driver of a vehicle by this title, including the duties set forth in § 21–504 of this title, except:
30	(1) As otherwise provided in this subtitle; and
31	(2) For those provisions of this title that by their very nature cannot apply.

Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, a person has the

rights and is subject to the restrictions applicable to pedestrians under this title while the 1 2person is lawfully operating a bicycle, play vehicle, or unicycle: 3 (i) On a sidewalk or sidewalk area; or 4 (ii) In or through a crosswalk. At an intersection, a person operating a bicycle, play vehicle, or unicycle 5 (2)6 is subject to all traffic control signals, as provided in §§ 21–202 and 21–203 of this title. 7 Section 21-506 of this title does not apply to a person operating a (3)8 bicycle, play vehicle, or unicycle. 9 NOTWITHSTANDING § 21–707(A) THROUGH (C) OF THIS TITLE, WHEN APPROACHING A STOP SIGN AT AN INTERSECTION WITH A HIGHWAY WITH TWO OR 10 11 FEWER LANES FOR MOVING TRAFFIC, A PERSON OPERATING A BICYCLE MAY 12 CAUTIOUSLY MAKE A TURN OR PROCEED THROUGH THE INTERSECTION WITHOUT 13 STOPPING IF THE PERSON OPERATING THE BICYCLE: 14 **(1)** REDUCES THE SPEED OF THE BICYCLE TO A REASONABLE RATE; 15 AND YIELDS THE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO: 16 **(2)** 17 **(I)** ANY VEHICLE IN THE INTERSECTION; AND 18 (II) ANY APPROACHING VEHICLE ON ANOTHER HIGHWAY THAT 19 IS NEAR ENOUGH TO THE INTERSECTION THAT IT POSES AN IMMEDIATE DANGER. 20 SECTION 2.
