- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 PART V. LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES PILOT PROGRAM.

- 21 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE
- 22 SERVICES PILOT PROGRAM.

- 1 (B) THERE IS A LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES PILOT PROGRAM.
- 2 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO:
- 3 (1) PROVIDE MEANINGFUL ACCESS TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE 4 TO CHILDREN WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY; AND
- 5 (2) ESTABLISH A COMPETITIVE GRANT PROCESS FOR LOCAL
- 6 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AUTHORITIES TO PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENT TO BEHAVIORAL
- 7 HEALTH PROVIDERS FOR LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES, INCLUDING
- 8 INTERPRETATION AND TRANSLATION SERVICES TO:
- 9 (I) CHILDREN WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY 10 ACCESSING AND RECEIVING BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES; AND
- 11 (II) PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS COORDINATING THE

- 16 REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING
- 17 REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH THE FOLLOWING:
- 18 (1) A REQUIREMENT THAT A GRANTEE DOCUMENT AND REPORT:
- 19 (I) THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN WHO RECEIVED LANGUAGE 20 ASSISTANCE SERVICES BROKEN DOWN BY PRIMARY LANGUAGE SPOKEN;
- 21 (II) THE NUMBER OF PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS WHO
- 22 RECEIVED LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES BROKEN DOWN BY PRIMARY
- 23 LANGUAGE SPOKEN; AND
- 24 (III) THE NUMBER OF LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES THAT
- 25 WERE REIMBURSED BROKEN DOWN BY THE TYPE OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICE
- 26 PROVIDED; AND
- 27 (2) A REQUIREMENT THAT, TO REQUEST AND RECEIVE A
- 28 REIMBURSEMENT FROM A PROGRAM GRANTEE, A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER MUST:

- 1 (I) BE A LICENSED AND ACCREDITED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH 2 PROVIDER; AND
- 3 (II) HAVE A CURRENT, WRITTEN LANGUAGE ACCESS PLAN
  4 DEMONSTRATING HOW THE PROVIDER ENSURES MEANINGFUL ACCESS TO ITS
  5 PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH
  6 PROFICIENCY.
- 7 (F) THE LANGUAGE ACCESS PLAN REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (E)(2)(II) 8 OF THIS SECTION SHALL:
- 9 (1) BE PROVIDED TO THE GRANTEE IN ADDITION TO ANY REQUEST 10 FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES; AND
- 11 **(2)** INCLUDE:
- 12 (I) A SELF-ASSESSMENT OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER 13 WHICH THE PROVIDER MAY ENCOUNTER AN INDIVIDUAL WITH LIMITED ENGLISH 14 PROFICIENCY;
- 15 (II) A SELF-ASSESSMENT OF THE NUMBER OR PROPORTION OF 16 INDIVIDUALS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY FROM EACH LANGUAGE GROUP 17 IN THE PROVIDER'S SERVICE AREA TO DETERMINE APPROPRIATE LANGUAGE
- 18 ASSISTANCE SERVICES;
- 19 (III) THE PROVIDER'S PROCEDURE FOR IDENTIFYING AN 20 INDIVIDUAL'S PRIMARY LANGUAGE;
- 21 (IV) THE PROVIDER'S PROCEDURE FOR PROVIDING LANGUAGE 22 ASSISTANCE SERVICES, INCLUDING ORAL AND WRITTEN LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE 23 SERVICES;
- 24 (V) THE PROVIDER'S PROCEDURE FOR ENSURING EFFECTIVE 25 COMMUNICATION WITH INDIVIDUALS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY IN 26 LANGUAGES ENCOUNTERED LESS FREQUENTLY;
- 27 (VI) THE PROVIDER'S PLAN FOR TRAINING STAFF ON THE 28 PROVIDER'S POLICIES AND PROCEDURES; AND
- (VII) THE PROVIDER'S PROCEDURE FOR PROVIDING NOTICE OF
  LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES AT NO COST TO INDIVIDUALS WITH LIMITED
  ENGLISH PROFICIENCY.

- 1 (G) FOR EACH OF FISCAL YEARS 2025 AND 2026, THE GOVERNOR SHALL 2 INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$120,000 TO THE 3 PROGRAM.
- 4 (H) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL AWARD, AT A MINIMUM, THREE GRANTS OF \$30,000 EACH IN EACH OF FISCAL YEARS 2025 AND 2026.
- 6 (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2025, 2026, AND 2027, THE 7 ADMINISTRATION SHALL SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 8 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY A REPORT 9 ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM THAT INCLUDES:
- 10 (1) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH
  11 PROFICIENCY WHO RECEIVED LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES BROKEN DOWN BY
  12 JURISDICTION;
- 13 (2) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF CHILDREN WHO RECEIVED LANGUAGE
  14 ASSISTANCE SERVICES BROKEN DOWN BY PRIMARY LANGUAGE SPOKEN;
- 15 (3) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS WHO 16 RECEIVED LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES BROKEN DOWN BY PRIMARY 17 LANGUAGE SPOKEN;
- 18 (4) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES THAT
  19 WERE REIMBURSED BROKEN DOWN BY THE TYPE OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICE
  20 PROVIDED; AND
- 21 (5) THE TOTAL AMOUNT IN GRANT MONEY PROVIDED TO EACH 22 GRANTEE DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
