BY adding to Article - State Government Section 9-3801 through 9-3806 to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle Commission for the Deaf, Deafblind, and Hard of Hearing" Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1.
