CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Education - Blind and Visually Impaired Students - Textbook Equity

3 FOR the purpose of requiring establishing requirements for each county board of education, on or before a certain date each year, to determine regarding the provision of the 4 5 instructional materials that will be used in the upcoming school year for certain 6 students; requiring the county board to coordinate with the Instructional Resources 7 Center within the State Department of Education to provide instructional materials in a specialized format to blind or visually impaired students not later than a certain 8 9 day in the upcoming school year; requiring the Department to cover the cost to 10 produce certain instructional materials that are not available in a specialized format: 11 requiring certain textbook publishers to provide an electronic file of certain textbooks 12 to the National Instructional Materials Access Center; requiring the Instructional 13 Resources Center to submit a report on or before a certain date each year; requiring 14 the Department to report certain findings to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; and generally relating to textbook equity for blind 15 16 and visually impaired students.

- 1 (9) "Print instructional materials" means printed textbooks and related 2 printed core materials that are written and published primarily for use in elementary 3 school and secondary school instruction and are required by the Department or county 4 board for use by students in the classroom.
 - (10) "Specialized formats" means braille, large print, audio, or digital text that is used by blind or visually impaired individuals.

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- (b) (1) In developing the individualized education program for a child who is blind or visually impaired, provisions shall be made for instruction in braille and the use of braille unless the IEP team determines, after an evaluation of the child's reading and writing skills, needs, and appropriate reading and writing media, including an evaluation of the child's future needs for instruction in braille or the use of braille, that such instruction or use is not appropriate for the child.
- 13 (i) A child may not be denied the opportunity for instruction in 14 braille reading and writing solely because the child has some remaining vision.
- 15 (ii) This section does not require the exclusive use of braille if other 16 reading and writing media are appropriate to the child's educational needs. The use of other 17 reading and writing media does not preclude the use of braille or the instruction of braille.
- 18 (2) For the purpose of achieving successful implementation of this subsection, the State Board and the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board shall adopt certification standards for teachers of blind and visually impaired students.
 - (3) (i) The Department shall collaborate with and provide support to the Instructional Resources Center to develop procedures to coordinate the statewide availability of textbooks and supplementary instructional materials that may be accessed using specialized formats that use NIMAS.
 - (ii) 1. The procedures developed under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall require the Department and a county board to include, in any procurement contract or other document or agreement used to purchase print instructional materials from a publisher, a provision that requires the publisher to:
- A. On or before the delivery of the print instructional materials, prepare and provide the National Instructional Materials Access Center electronic files containing the contents of the print instructional materials using NIMAS; or
- B. Purchase instructional materials from that publisher that are produced in, or may be rendered in, specialized formats.
- 35 2. A publisher may not be required to provide an electronic copy of any instructional material copyrighted before July 1, 2007.

- 1 (iii) The State Board shall coordinate with the National Instructional 2 Materials Access Center to facilitate the timely transfer to the Instructional Resources
- 3 Center of:
- 4 1. Electronic files or instructional materials sent by
- 5 publishers for the Instructional Resources Center to convert the instructional materials
- 6 into specialized formats; and
- 7 2. Electronic files or instructional materials purchased from
- 8 a publisher in a specialized format.
- 9 (iv) Beginning on July 1, 2007, the Instructional Resources Center
- 10 shall make reasonable efforts to provide the instructional materials in specialized formats
- 11 to students who are blind or visually impaired for use on the first day of classes each year
- 12 or in a timely manner.
- 13 (V) 1. ON OR BEFORE JANUARY MARCH 15, 2025, AND EACH
- 14 JANUARY MARCH 15 THEREAFTER, EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE
- 15 INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS THAT WILL BE USED IN THE UPCOMING SCHOOL YEAR
- 16 BY STUDENTS WITH INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAMS UNDER PARAGRAPH
- 17 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AND PLANS UNDER SECTION 504 OF THE FEDERAL

- 35 (4) (I) Beginning in fiscal year 2008 and annually thereafter, the
- 36 Governor shall include \$150,000 in the annual budget submission for the Instructional
- 37 Resources Center established by the Department.

- 1 (II) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE SUPPORT TO THE 2 INSTRUCTIONAL RESOURCES CENTER TO ENSURE THAT TEXTBOOKS AND 3 SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS IN A SPECIALIZED FORMAT ARE 4 AVAILABLE TO BLIND AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED STUDENTS STATEWIDE.
- 5 (5) On or before September 1, 2012, the State Board shall establish 6 standards for the mastery of braille for use in English, language arts, and mathematics 7 instruction of blind and visually impaired students in pre–kindergarten through grade 12.
- 8 (6) BEGINNING ON JANUARY 1, 2025, A PUBLISHER THAT SELLS
 9 PUPIL EDITION TEXTBOOKS IN THE STATE SHALL PROVIDE TO THE NATIONAL
 10 INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS ACCESS CENTER AN ELECTRONIC FILE OF THE
 11 TEXTBOOK IN THE NIMAS STANDARD IN A TIMELY MANNER.
- 12 **(E) (1) O**N OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2026, AND EACH OCTOBER 1
 13 THEREAFTER, THE INSTRUCTIONAL RESOURCES CENTER SHALL SUBMIT TO THE
 14 DEPARTMENT A REPORT ON THE ACCESSIBILITY AND DELIVERY OF TEXTBOOKS AND
 15 SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS DURING THE PREVIOUS SCHOOL
 16 YEAR, INCLUDING:
- 17 (I) THE NUMBER OF ELECTRONIC FILES PUBLISHERS 18 PROVIDED TO NIMAS; AND
- 19 (II) THE NUMBER OF REQUESTS FOR INSTRUCTIONAL 20 MATERIALS IN A SPECIALIZED FORMAT THAT COULD NOT BE FULFILLED AND AN 21 EXPLANATION REGARDING WHY THE REQUEST COULD NOT BE FULFILLED.
- 22 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL POST ON ITS WEBSITE THE 23 INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM THE INSTRUCTIONAL RESOURCES CENTER IN 24 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION.
- (F) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2026, AND EACH DECEMBER 31
 THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS ON THE EQUITY OF
 TEXTBOOKS AND SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS FOR BLIND AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED
 STUDENTS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE
 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 30 [(e)] (G) The State Board shall adopt regulations:
- 31 (1) Consistent with § 7–910 of this article; and
- 32 (2) To implement the provisions of this section.
