Baltimore Safe Haven provides at-risk TLGBQ people in Maryland with opportunities to transform their lives. This community is one of the nations most threatened by violence, trauma, and housing insecurities because of gender identity and sexual orientation. Baltimore Safe Haven focuses on members with an annual income of less than \$10,000 who are currently homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Baltimore Safe Haven provides Marylanders that are TLGBQ people living in survival mode with opportunities to thrive. Baltimore Safe Haven envisioned a world in which all transgender, lesbian, gay, bisexual, and queer TLGBQ people to enjoy healthy self-determined self-sufficient lives, liberated from the stigma violence, and oppression they suffer.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Baltimore Safe Haven is the only LGBTQ housing provider for the entire state of Maryland for ages 18 through seniors. Baltimore Safe Haven currently has a waiting list with over a 1000 LGBTQ homeless or at risk of being homeless Marylanders waiting to obtain housing. Baltimore Safe Haven currently offers low-barrier shelter, transitional housing, an emergency hypothermia shelter, and permanent housing. An Expansion of Baltimore Safe Haven's Housing Program will double bed spaces for the most marginalized community members, giving LGBTQ Marylanders a passage to safe, equal, and fair housing opportunities--free from discrimination and harassment.

## 28. Comments

Years of research and countless studies have repeatedly shown that discrimination threatens not only access to housing but the stability of communities. Members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (LGBTQ) community are more likely to become homeless because of gender dysphoria, and once homeless, more likely to endure discrimination and harassment when seeking fair housing opportunities that extends their homelessness. LGBTQ experiencing homelessness are at particular risk.

Between 20 and 40 percent of homeless LGBTQ-identifying community are without shelter and for

them, homelessness or the threat of homelessness frequently forces them into survival behaviors that jeopardize their wellbeing and safety. A Maryland for all starts with this step forward ensuring all Marylanders have equal and fair housing opportunities. Baltimore Safe Haven's programs provide life-sustaining work; and because of LGBTQ Marylanders who ensured no one was left behind, Baltimore Safe Haven created history in Baltimore with the first LGBTQ housing program. Please continue the passage for fair housing for all and leave no one behind.
