The Bayside History Museum operates as a local history museum and archive. We are responsible for the preservation and collection of tangible artifacts. The Bayside History Museum has scanned more than 415,000 documents for conservation and some of these collections are available on its website. These are one-of-a-kind items such as original Town of North Beach and Chesapeake Beach records and local historical country store ledgers. We offer educational opportunities for all ages throughout the year. We are the designated museum for AP students from Huntingtown High School. We hire an average of 5 HHS students every summer. 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The Bayside History Museum is housed in a 2-story building that was initially built to accommodate the North Beach Volunteer Fire Department (NBVFD) in 1926. It operated as the NBVFD until 1971 when the NBVFD was relocated to Chesapeake Beach. In 1981, significant additions were constructed for the new Twin Beaches Library. A flat roof was constructed at that time. This building later housed a community center before becoming the Bayside History Museum in 2013. The flat roof built in 1981 has now reached the end of its lifespan. Several recent storms have caused water to leak into the exhibit/office spaces below. A new roof is desperately needed to protect our exhibits, artifacts, and documents.

28. Comments

The first North Beach Volunteer Fire Department building was built in 1926. It had 2 fire truck bays and an upstairs room for volunteers to sleep in. When the local elementary school closed in the 1970s, the NBVFD moved to its current location in Chesapeake Beach.

Over the years, the current building served as the offices of Alcoholism, Drug Abuse and Mental Health, Calvert County Parks and Recreation Department, the Twin Beaches Library branch, Twin Beach Players, meeting space for the Town of North Beach, and numerous other uses.

In 2013, the Bayside History Museum, along with the Town of North Beach, entered into a thirty (30) year lease for the building to be used as the Bayside History Museum, Inc.

The current roof is aging and has reached the end of its useable lifespan. Storms have caused several leaks to form in the roof, damaging ceiling tiles and threatening to ruin exhibits, artifacts, and collections. It is no longer adequate to protect the museum from precipitation.

These funds will go towards the purchase and installation of new roofing materials to replace our existing, inadequate roof. The comprehensive replacement of the roof will give the Bayside History Museum the ability to carry out its mission for the local community and all visitors for the next several decades.
