10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)						
Since 1945, Easterseals DC MD VA has worked tirelessly to enhance quality of life and expand access to healthcare, education, and employment. We take a holistic approach, providing comprehensive services to thousands of children and adults regardless of their disability, military status, income, race, or age. To help each child reach their full potential, we provide personalized child development and early intervention services. To improve health and reduce isolation in adults with disabilities, we offer engaging activities and expansive resources. To enable military families to integrate into the community, we provide a suite of services, including employment support and mental healthcare. And to sustain families and caregivers, we provide comprehensive services and supports.						

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Washington County is a childcare desert. With more than 8,500 children younger than age 5, and less than 3,500 licensed spots among existing childcare providers, less than 40% of the countys children have a spot in childcare. There is not a single National Association for the Education of Young Children accredited center in all of Washington County. Easterseals DC MD VA is proposing a state-of-the art child development center to begin to address this critical shortage. Washington County Public Schools (WCPS) estimates a need for about 750 3-year-old slots and views this project as key to improving school readiness. This state-of-the art facility will accommodate 172 children ages 6 weeks to 4-years-old and meet a critical community need for a program that serves infants and toddlers, helps parents return to the workforce, prepares students for kindergarten, and complements Pillar One (Early Childhood Education) of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.

28. Comments

Easterseals was approached in 2021 by a coalition of business leaders, including the Washington County Chamber of Commerce, Greater Hagerstown Committee, Washington County Industrial Foundation, Washington County Public Schools, local economic development officials, and other community leaders, to bring its child development services to Washington County. All these parties consider available, quality childcare as an imperative for the economic growth of the area.

Western Maryland is seeing an explosion of new projects and new jobs, particularly in the logistics, distribution, and manufacturing industries. To fill these jobs, the community will need to attract new people to Washington County, leverage populations often overlooked, and improve labor participation rates, which have remained at historical lows since COVID. The lack of affordable childcare has been identified as one of the major contributors to the workforce shortage. This project not only increases the amount of affordable childcare seats, but also provides spaces for children with special needs thanks to Easterseals accredited services and ability to care for children with disabilities.

Easterseals currently operates eight highly successful child development centers and Head Start programs. Its inclusive classrooms create an environment in which children of all abilities, income levels, and the military status of the family learn new skills, develop relationships, share a sense of belonging, prepare for school, and appreciate diversity in others.

Research affirms the long-term benefits of high-quality early childhood education. According to Nobel prize-winning economist James Heckman, these benefits include more years of education, higher graduation rates, higher adult employment income, better health outcomes, permanent gains in IQ, and higher parental income.
