10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Epoch is a free after-school & summer program serving under-resourced KIDS in western Wicomico County in grades K-12. Epoch strives to create nurturing relationships that empower, mentor & encourage students in the areas of academics, character development & social-economic wellness. We envision a community in which all students have the support, resources & opportunities to reach their greatest potential as thriving, compassionate individuals. Epoch is not simply a place for students to attend outside of school but a place to belong. It is an all-encompassing, holistic experience for participants that retains students from year to year, through high school graduation. The program accomplishes this through the provision of academic support, extra-curricular opportunities, nightly family-style dinners & relationship development through one-on-one mentorship.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Epoch Dream Center is the only no-cost after-school program for youth in western Wicomico County. The program has traditionally rented classroom space and the gym at a local church in Hebron; however, as of August 2023, that space has become unavallable. Hebron requires a large, dedicated space that W1ll accommodate growth and facilitate program development operated by the Epoch Dream Center, whose experience and results speak for themselves. However, there is no commercial or office space in Hebron nor the larger catchment area from which participants are drawn. A new facility will not only increase Epoch's program capacity, but it will also serve as a community center for Hebron and the surrounding rural towns. Hebron's town commissioners have recognized the value of the program and understand the benefit of a community center, so they have leased a plot of land to the Epoch Dream Center for a dollar a year for 50 years on which to build their permanent

Students and families in rural Hebron and western Wicomico County do not have access to resources without traveling to acquire them. A permanent building to house the Epoch Dream Center in Hebron would even the playing field for those students and their families.
