The Vision of Serenity Sistas Inc. is to facilitate a recovering individual to re-enter life as a productive member of the community by providing an evidence-based living structure and sober environment. We offer an essential haven for the newly recovering individual, which we believe is vital for positive progress. Est. in 2012, we offer homes for single women and men. In 2015 through a partnership with the Anne Arundel County Department of Health we added a home for women with children and 2024 will see the first men with childrens home in Maryland. Through all of our experience we have found that "wrap around" services is vital to those in recovery to sustain their recovery and personal growth. The GPJRCC will offer free services to those in recovery and their families.

The George Phillips Jr. Recovery Community Center is a recovery-oriented sanctuary anchored in the heart of Anne Arundel County. The GPJRCC provides peer-based recovery support services using a volunteer force to deliver a vast majority of these services. The center assists anyone in their recovery journey no matter where they are in their process. Ultimately, this is a place to find workshops, training and educational sessions to enhance ones own recovery. We envision a world in which people are able to seek recovery from substance use disorder free from stigma in an environment rich in support services. Providing support services to all people, their families, and friends who seek to sustain recovery from substance use disorder, helping all who seek to recover from substance use disorder the opportunity to thrive, not just survive!

28. Comments

In 2015 Serenity Sistas in collaboration with Recovery Anne Arundel conducted a Recovery community needs assessment in Anne Arundel County. The findings in the final report showed that individuals and their families were suffering needlessly before, during and after their loved ones entered clinical treatment to overcome their addiction. Many stated that they did not know how to navigate the complex system of treatment and aftercare and had no one place to find that information. Additionally, those new to recovery had no resources to help them proceed in their new life free from drugs and alcohol. Giving individuals hope and helping them find a purpose in life is a vital component to long term recovery.

The vision of a "recovery" community center was born in 2018 along with the creation of a pocket size resource guide (in 5 years we have distributed 25,000) for the community. A team of dedicated individuals began writing grants to fund both projects. To date we have been able to secure a location and pay down the mortgage through a grant from the Maryland Department of Health. Through other various funding sources and grants: Opioid Operational Command Center, Anne Arundel Department of Health, County Executive Community Grants, Arundel Community Development Center, Annapolis City, Saint Margarets Church and our own funds we have raised close to 1.5 million dollars to date.

COVID 19 slowed our progress of construction and taught us that isolation is the worst enemy of an individual suffering from a substance use disorder. Isolation created a surge of return to use periods and at times death from fentanyl poisoning.

As COVID restrictions have lifted our team has been working diligently to complete the George Phillips Jr Recovery Community Center, opening the doors to Anne Arundel County residents.

George Phillips, Jr. believed in people when they didnt believe in themselves. A true champion of recovery, he knew that recovery from substance use disorder was possible and worked tirelessly for all who suffered with addiction. During his tenure (1999-2020) with the Anne Arundel County Health Department, George pioneered and implemented many programs that walked the walk of his passion to reduce the stigma associated with substance use disorder. His legacy is the Recovery Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC), known today as Recovery Anne Arundel, that he started. Recovery Anne Arundel was the first organization in the County that brought together community-based, private, and public organizations that worked to promote health and wellness for anyone seeking recovery from substance use disorder. George was instrumental in ensuring that Anne Arundel County has a true continuum of care. George passed away on February 3, 2021. Given his countless contributions to the recovery community in Anne Arundel County, naming the Recovery Community Center after George is a fitting tribute.

Our team has high hopes that you too will walk the walk and join the recovery champions that will bring this project to completion by approving our request.
