Unfortunately, there is a small portion of trail, approximately 1550 linear feet, that remains in its natural state making it inaccessible to those with disabilities or mobility issues. This project will pave this portion of trail according to ADA standards and provide adequate accessibility to the entire trail system.

There is section of LSHG Trail located in Perryville that is unfinished. It is located within the Perryville Community Park in Perryville. The Community Park consists of 144 acres, allows for significant wildlife viewing, exploration of plant life, access to the water and boasts a 3.5 mile trail that also runs through the adjoining Veterans Administration property. Providing for hiking, running, and biking this trail, also known as the Community Park and VA Trail Loop, has paved surfaces for 90% of its length. Unfortunately, there is a small portion of trail, approximately 1550 linear feet, that remains in its natural state making it inaccessible to those with disabilities or mobility issues. This project will pave this portion of trail according to ADA standards and provide adequate accessibility to the entire trail system. These funds will be used toward paving of the trail surface and the stormwater requirements such as bioswales, ditching, and excavation. Design and engineering for the

project is complete and a request for proposal is available to advertised.
