Mission: To develop physical fitness and education among under-served at-risk youth while developing the members confidence, respect for authority, and educational excellence. The program uses the sport of amateur boxing together with an Out of School Learning Program to achieve its Mission. The Gym works with members to ensure satisfying grades by providing tutoring services and school visits by Gym Staff. Professional speakers from the community come to the Gym addressing topics such as negative effects of drugs, resisting gang involvement, and a variety of health-related issues. The members also take educational field trips. Our 2023 parent survey resulted in 82% of the parents stating their Childs grades improved and 88% stating their Childs behavior in school improved as a result of attending Main Street Gym's program.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of the project is to make capital improvements to the facility. The current flooring in one area of the facility limits the usage of the area. The new flooring would allow the current youth members in the program to learn the sport of pickleball as well as have a safer non slip floor area for basketball and the boxing program. The existing floor is not usable for such activity. To achieve this floor system will require significant floor preparation with grinding and various coatings. This will allow the program to be utilized on Saturdays as well as more hours during the week. Through normal use the insulation in the building has been compromised and needs to be fixed in a number of areas including the high ceilings and walls of the facility which should help to lower heating cost. We also plan on re-coating the floors in the bath rooms if funds allow.
