10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

The Marlton Swim and Recreation Club, Inc. is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, dedicated to providing a safe and fun outdoor swimming environment for the community. The organization manages a 25-meter outdoor pool and a Splash Pad feature. Facilities include a shower/bathroom building and a pavilion with picnic tables. The pool is open to the public and offers daily entry at an affordable rate in addition to season passes. Local day care centers reserve time at the pool on a weekly basis for recreation and swim lessons and a swim team uses the pool for practices and swim meets. Swimming lessons are offered to the public plus aqua fitness sessions. The pool presents employment opportunities for high school teens and college-aged adults and participates in the Prince George's Summer Youth Enrichment Program.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This project includes replacement of the pool's filtering system. This would include purchase of three larger capacity filters to replace the four old filters and replacement of our pump. It includes replacement of all connecting hardware, which is aged and leaking. The result would be greater energy efficiency in filtration resulting in improved water flow through the pool/filter system. We barely passed our health department inspection last summer because of leaks. We want to avoid failure of the system. The twelve skimmers around the pool need to be replaced; the skimmer itself and the concrete block that houses the skimmer. There are patches upon patches in the skimmers, but we still losing and wasting water. Finally, replacing the coping and tile around the top edge of the pool is required as it is chipping and degraded. Again, these are health department inspection requirements.

Our entry fees to the pool are very affordable so as to allow the community to take advantage

of outdoor recreation and swimming instruction. Marlton Pool is the only local community pool to offer a daily entry rate, instead of only season memberships. This especially is helpful

for lower-income families. Unfortunately, our revenue doesn't allow for the costly repair projects that are associated with a facility built over 50 years ago. (Although we are saving to

be able to handle these jobs in the future.) We do receive donations, but they cover smaller expenses such as training for our lifeguards, subsidizing swimming lessons and deck furniture. Our strength is our volunteer force. Our neighborhood volunteers take care of landscaping for our grounds and put in many hours in supervision of operations. Families, singles, seniors, the swim team and children in day care are happy for this opportunity for outdoor recreation and appreciate the State of Maryland's support.
